



Fire- Volunteer Fire Chief Chris Wolonsky said that they are moving forward with refurbishing and ambulance. He said a complaint was filed against a Superior Ambulance paramedic. Mayor Dial has reached out to the County to discuss possible options for EMT services. Chief Wolonsky said that the County is going to lose their Medical Director also. Trustee Lovato thanked volunteer EMT Linda Gutierrez for her response to a family in an emergency recently. Her response was outstanding and commendable. She is a true asset to the community and is very much appreciated.

They were also working on a waterline repair on Salt Mission Trail. He recently completed some rural water training that he said was very informative. He is working towards getting his water certification.

Administration- Clerk/Treasurer Michelle Jones said that her office is also very busy. They recently completed their annual audit and completed the recent road COOP project. She is following up with the State on a few grants that we are waiting to hear back about. We will be moving forward with the DOT TPF and MAP projects soon.

 Realtor Keith Sandy presented two offers he received for the property at 405 5th St. He presented the final net revenue from each. The Board chose the offer with the highest net revenue. - 7.0 Review of Proposed EMS Job description and discussion concerning Superior Ambulance-Discussion and Possible Action Trustee Lovato said that at this time, we have zero oversight. Mountainair has one full-time employee at this time. Mayor Dial said he has reached out to the County but they are not responding; we need to be proactive. The Town has 4 volunteer certified EMTs at this time. Chief Wolonsky suggested creating positions to work 4-ten hour shifts weekly. At this time, we can't provide housing. ACTION TAKEN: Trustee Sedillo made a motion to draft a job description on Town Letterhead with salaries that fit our current budget and post pending legal review. Trustee Hall seconded the motion. - Approval of the Mayor's hiring of Mr. Edwin Bencomo to the position of Public Works Supervisor-Action Item Clerk Jones told the Board that interviews had been conducted for the position of Public Works Supervisor and Mr. Edwin Bencomo scored the highest and we are seeking approval of the Mayor's hiring of Mr. Bencomo. The Trustee's, as well as the Mayor and Clerk, are very happy that a current Public Works employee was promoted to this position. We all wish Edwin the very best of luck as he takes on this new challenge. ACTION TAKEN: Trustee Lovato made a motion to approve the Mayor's hiring of Mr. Edwin Bencomo to the position of Public Works Supervisor. Trustee Sedillo seconded the motion. All in favor.

15.0 Mayor/Council:

Trustee Hall said that three houses in town have been refurbished; this is a very bright spot, and he is glad to see it. He told a story about an organ that, in 1962, he had been given permission to practice on. (Play on, I say!)

Trustee Chavez asked if the maintenance crew could sweep at the park prior to the Luminaria lighting. She said there is a big hole at the corner of Joseph at 6^{th} or 7^{th} . She also said that the trees at the Plaza look really good.

Trustee Lovato said that we are still waiting for the Christmas tree to be delivered. He said that he is running EYDG this year and may need to use the Community Center Gym from time to time.

Trustee Sedillo talked about the challenge of fixing roads. He said he will email about a zipper for the roads that could help.

Mayor Dial said he will be out of pocket from Wednesday to Friday.
